EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Rock of Ages Empowerment Foundation was founded in 2007 and registered as a corporate body on the 23rd June, 2009 under the Companies and Allied Matter Act, (Part 'C') 1990 of the federal Republic of Nigeria. We carry out free medical treatment; free education support programs, youth and widows empowerment.

The Rock of Ages Empowerment Foundation believes in restoring hope, giving hope to the widows and orphans and in so doing, the foundation uses her yearly international widow's day celebration to empower widows who were trained on different skills and also provide scholarship to the orphans.

The foundation carries out research, training, outreaches and public educational campaigns about the needs for widow's empowerment, orphans and other vulnerable groups in the society. It is committed to its mission of transforming the lives of the underprivileged individuals through quality education, good medical treatments, and financial support, regardless of age, gender, race, religion or financial status.

During the 2013 International Widows Day Celebration Rock of Ages Empowerment Foundation, over 16 million naira was spent to empower widows in various service delivery areas, 1500 widows received one bag of 10kg rice each, 800 widows were also given one bag of 10kg semovita each. 300 widows were trained on how to make liquid soap and empowered with cash to start up the business, whereas another 300 widows were also empowered with cash as start up grant for small scale business.

The medical component of the event of the 2013 International widows day celebration started with a health talk on various topics e.g hand wash, ebola control, HIV prevention messages by a trained nurse, involved the check of blood pressure, Clients were tested for malaria parasite, typhoid fever, arthritis, blood glucose, skin condition, worm cases. There was free consultation and free drugs. There were free eye checks, reading glasses were given to various people with eye defect. Referrals were made to appropriate health facility if any.

Out of 700 widows that participated in the medical diagnosis and treatment, 57% widows were diagnosed with malaria and were treated adequately, 7% widows were treated for hypertension, 6% were treated for diabetes mellitus, while 8% widows were treated for arthritis. More so, 9% widows were checked for eye problem and were treated with eye drops and reading glasses. 1% have skin condition cases, 8% worm cases, whereas, 5% widows that showed signs and symptoms of typhoid fever were treated.




Figure 1: Widows and orphans empowerment program




Figure 2: 2013 International Widows Day Free Medical diagnosis and treatment




Figure 3: 2013 International Widows Day Free Medical diagnosis and treatment
