We carry out free medical treatment; free education support programs, youth and widows empowerment.

The Rock of Ages Empowerment Foundation believes in restoring hope, giving hope to the widows and orphans and in so doing, the foundation uses her yearly international widow's day celebration to empower widows who were trained on different skills and also provide scholarship to the orphans.

The foundation carries out research, training, outreaches and public educational campaigns about the needs for widow's empowerment, orphans and other vulnerable groups in the society. It is committed to its mission of transforming the lives of the underprivileged individuals through quality education, good medical treatments, and financial support, regardless of age, gender, race, religion or financial status.

During the 2014 Widows Day Celebration Rock of Ages Empowerment Foundation, over 12 million naira was spent to empower widows in various service delivery areas, 2000 widows received one bag of 10kg rice each, 140 widows received finance and sewing machine each, 300 widows were finance and training on how to make liquid soap, whereas, 500 widows were given one fabrics -wrapper.

The medical component of the event of the 2014 International widows day celebration started with a health talk on various topics e.g hand wash, ebola control, HIV prevention messages by a trained nurse, involved the check of blood pressure, Clients were tested for malaria parasite, typhoid fever, arthritis, blood glucose, skin condition, worm cases. There was free consultation and free drugs. There were free eye check, reading glasses were given to various people with eye defect, other health indicators were diagnosed and treated. Referrals were made to appropriate health facility if any. Out of 1200 widows that took part in the free medical diagnosis and treatment, it is revealed that 49% were diagnosed and treated for malaria, 5% widows were diagnosed with hypertension and treated, 2% were diagnosed and treated for diabetes mellitus, 7% were treated for arthritis, eye defect cases, and worm respectively, 1% were treated for skin condition cases, whereas 11% were treated for dental cases and typhoid fever respectively.




Figure 1; 2014 International Widows Day




Figure 2; 2014 International Widows Day Free Medical diagnosis and treatment




Figure 3: 2014 International Widows Day Free Medical diagnosis and treatment




Figure 4: 2014 International Widows Day Free Medical diagnosis and treatment
